Bi-annual meeting of independent administrative and public authorities: simplification and efficiency at the heart of discussions

Paris, 3 December 2025 – On Tuesday 2 December 2025, the Energy Regulatory Commission (CRE) hosted the bi-annual meeting of independent administrative and public authorities (AAI/API)¹. This bi-annual meeting provides a valuable platform for dialogue, coordination and reflection on current regulatory challenges, both at national and European level.

The meeting opened with a presentation by Thierry Lambert, Interministerial Delegate for Public Transformation, who presented the missions of the Interministerial Directorate for Public Transformation (DITP). The DITP steers the Government's public transformation programme, aimed at delivering public action that is closer to citizens, simpler and more effective. These missions closely align with the AAI/API's priorities of simplification and efficiency, for the benefit of all audiences. The presentation was followed by discussions and exchanges on good practices implemented within each authority.

The current affairs of each authority were also discussed, along with an update on the progress of ongoing joint work, in particular regarding the clear understanding of regulatory decisions and, more broadly, on informing citizens – an essential condition for the effective delivery of the AAI/API's missions.

The meeting once again highlighted the strong commitment of the AAI and API operating in the field of economic regulation to coordinate their actions in order to address shared challenges. It offered a valuable opportunity for forward-looking reflection and the exchange of best practices, aimed at strengthening the effectiveness of their work.

The meeting brought together representatives from the French Competition Authority (ADLC), the Financial Markets Authority (AMF), the National Gambling Authority (ANJ), the Regulatory Authority for Electronic Communications, Postal Services and Press Distribution (Arcep), the Audiovisual and Digital Communication Regulatory Authority (Arcom), the Transport Regulatory
